AWARD FOR AN OUTSTANDING INDIVIDUAL

This award seeks to recognise an individual who has made an outstanding contribution to promoting and supporting sustainable transport, especially cutting CO₂ emissions. The winner will receive an awards package and a cash prize of \$1,000.

ELIGIBILITY

An individual who has demonstrated commitment, innovation and excellence through action, education, promotion, lobbying, policy development and encouragement for sustainable transport. This person will have made a positive contribution in the community through providing assistance, creating awareness and initiatives that encourage sustainable transport patronage.

NOMINATIONS FOR THIS AWARD SHOULD INCLUDE:

- 🚲 Material describing the specific commitments and contributions made to sustainable transport by the nominee and why the nominee should receive the award
- 🚲 Supporting documentation including at least one written reference

SPECIAL ACHIEVEMENT BY AN ORGANISATION

This award seeks to recognise excellence, ingenuity and special achievement in facilitating, promoting and encouraging sustainable transport by a WA organisation, especially cutting CO₂ emissions. In addition to the awards package, a non-profit/community organisation winner will receive a cash prize of \$1,000.

ELIGIBILITY

A Western Australian business or non-government organisation that creates awareness and implements initiatives that encourage participation in sustainable transport options either in the community or internally to their organisation.

The nominee should have demonstrated a prolonged organisational commitment to sustainable transport initiatives.

NOMINATIONS FOR THIS AWARD SHOULD INCLUDE:

- 🚲 Information on the nominated organisation - history, members/staff/volunteers
- 🚲 A description of why the nominee should receive the award
- 🚲 The specific commitments made by the organisation to sustainable transport

RURAL OR REGIONAL INNOVATION AWARD

This award seeks to recognise excellence, ingenuity and special achievement in facilitating, promoting and encouraging sustainable transport, especially cutting CO₂ emissions, by those who live beyond the Network City boundary [individual, non-government organisation or business]. The winner will receive an awards package and a cash prize of \$1,000 (individual or community organisation only).

ELIGIBILITY

An individual or organisation that creates awareness and implements initiatives that encourage participation in sustainable transport options (in the community or internally to the organisation).

The nominee should live or be based beyond the Network City boundary (ie Mandurah-Armadale-Midland-Quinns Rocks).

NOMINATIONS FOR THIS AWARD SHOULD INCLUDE:

- 🚲 Information on the nominated organisation - history, members/staff/volunteers
- 🚲 A description of why the nominee should receive the award
- 🚲 The specific commitments made by the organisation to sustainable transport



THE AWARDS PACKAGE

THE WINNER IN EACH CATEGORY WILL RECEIVE:

- 🚲 A wall plaque with their award
- 🚲 A cash prize of \$1,000 (for individuals and community organisations only)
- 🚲 Publicity for the nominee and their contributions toward sustainable transport

GOVERNMENT INNOVATION AWARD

These awards aim to provide recognition of the critical role that local and state government agencies play in facilitating and encouraging use of transport alternatives and bringing about a sustainable future. The winners in each category will receive an Awards package.

Winner Government Innovation Award 2004: Perth Fuel Cell Bus Trial



A) LOCAL GOVERNMENT INNOVATION AWARD

ELIGIBILITY

A local government that has encouraged and promoted the uptake of sustainable transport alternatives, supported by a strategic approach by the nominated organisation. Projects may include innovative design and development of infrastructure or technology.

B) STATE GOVERNMENT INNOVATION AWARD

ELIGIBILITY

A state government agency that has encouraged and promoted the uptake of sustainable transport alternatives, supported by a strategic approach by the nominated organisation. Projects may be individual or collaborative, and include innovative design and development of infrastructure or technology, green transport plans, or internal strategies to improve its own sustainability.

NOMINATIONS FOR THESE AWARDS SHOULD INCLUDE:

- 🚲 An outline of the initiative/project and its achievements
- 🚲 The length of time the initiative has been running
- 🚲 The impacts on alternative modes of transport
- 🚲 The organisations involved
- 🚲 The strategic planning for the initiative
